First Thoughts

There is a very important Bible verse that has special meaning for my wife and me. In fact, we have it inscribed on the inside of our wedding rings. (But please don't ask to see it – I can't get my wedding ring off my finger anymore! Trust me, it is written there.) The verse is from 1 Corinthians 3:9. We have the King James Version inscribed which reads, "For we are labourers together with God." The full verse in a newer translation reads, "For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building." (NRSV) In the church we work together with each other – and we work together with God.

This verse was important to Jane and me. We married when we were both seminary students preparing for a life of ministry. From the very beginning we wanted our marriage to be a partnership in ministry. It has been that for 37 years now.

The last phrase of that verse in 1 Corinthians 3:9 is a helpful image. It reads, "you are God's field, God's building." Think of a field where plants of all kind are growing. Every plant has roots that sink into the field. Imagine a building that is built. Every building needs to be set on a firm foundation. Roots and foundations are not very visible, but they are essential.

Working together with each other and with God is not only a good way to have a marriage -- it is at the very foundation of a healthy and vital church. The love we have for God is lived out in our service to one another and to the church. Just like roots and foundations, often this service is hidden from most people. Some of the most powerful acts of service do not happen in the spotlight, but in the shadows. A church is filled with vital ministry if it is filled with servant Christians who do not care about being in the spotlight or who do not care about getting the credit. This hidden service takes the form of a private prayer that you pray but no one sees, food that is taken to a home without a large crowd there to cheer for you, or a hug that is given in the hallway of the church to offer encouragement even when no one is looking.

This Sunday we talk about how we can be "labourers together with God" as we develop serving hearts in our church. I look forward to exploring with you how we can give generously through our service to God.

It seems we don't seriously understand Christian stewardship, which involves the totality of our lives with its gifts, talents, possessions, and potential. However, as a church family, we are presently in the area of ministry where we focus on the opportunity to give our financial support to enable us to carry out missions. Nothing so demonstrates the tangible change in our lives brought about by Christ as the willingness to give our money. If we could see our lives as salt, light, and a living temple as Christ presents us to demonstrate our faith, it would transform our concept of Christian giving. Our financial contributions to the cause of Christ is a very good gauge of our spiritual maturity. When one sixth of scripture has to deal with stewardship of things and one half of the parables of which Jesus told had to do with the stewardship of things, it reflects the importance of a right attitude toward possessions where we can easily become idolatrous. Our Stewardship Committee has issued the challenge to increase our giving one percent, which would enable us to meet present goals. Imagine how much greater our impact would be on missions and ministry as a church if we embraced God's direction to give according to His blessings. Alone we can do little, but together, under the leadership of God and His power, we can make a greater difference.

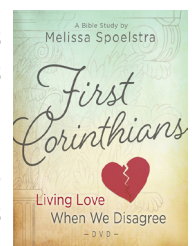
Women's Morning Bible Study!
